107th CONGRESS KEY SMALL BUSINESS VOTES

15 SENATE VOTES

1. HEALTH INSURANCE TAX CREDITS. (Roll Call Vote 83). The pro-small business vote was to provide tax credits for small businesses to purchase health insurance for their employees; and to provide for the deductibility of health insurance for the self-employed, and for those who do not receive health insurance from their employers. High health insurance costs force many businesses to either cancel insurance, raise prices, or cut jobs

2. REDUCE CAPITAL GAINS TAXES. (Roll Call Vote 115). The pro-small business vote was to increase investment in businesses and create new jobs by providing a temporary reduction in the capital gains tax rate from 20 percent to 15 percent.

3. REJECT INCREASING TAXES AND SPENDING. (Roll Call Vote 122). The pro-small business vote was to reject a proposal to reduce the tax reductions in the Bush tax plan and use the higher taxes to fund increased government spending.

4. NO NEW INTERNET TAXES. (Roll Call Vote 128). The pro-small business vote was to encourage continued growth in Internet access by making permanent the current prohibition against taxing the Internet. New taxes on the Internet would choke one of the fastest growing opportunities for small businesses and their customers.

5. REJECT AUTOMATIC INCOME TAX INCREASES. (Roll Call Vote 147). The pro-small business vote was to reject a scheme to automatically increase income taxes rates if congressional spending breaks the federal budget.

6. PRESIDENT BUSH'S TAX CUT PLAN. (Roll Call Vote 170). The pro-small business vote was to support enactment of President Bush's tax cut plan which cut income taxes across the board and phased out the death tax.

7. 100% HEALTH CARE TAX DEDUCTION. (Roll Call Vote 194). The pro-small business vote was to allow a vote on increasing the tax deductibility of health insurance costs for the self-employed to 100% on January 1st, 2002.

8. DON'T LET THE LAWYERS TAKE AWAY YOUR HEALTH INSURANCE. (Roll Call Vote 197). The pro-small business vote was to protect employers from lawsuits under the "patient's rights" bill. Lawsuits threaten to kill jobs and force employers to drop health coverage for their employees.

9. FULL ACCESS TO MEDICAL SAVINGS ACCOUNTS. (Roll Call Vote 216). The pro-small business vote was to allow a vote in support of eliminating government limits on access to Medical Savings Accounts (MSA's). MSA's give employees more control over their own health care spending; and allows them to keep the savings for themselves.

10. DON'T INCREASE HEALTH CARE COSTS. (Roll Call Vote 220). The pro-small business vote was to reject the Senate version of the "patient's rights" legislation. By encouraging unlimited lawsuits against employers and raising health insurance costs, the Senate version makes it more likely that small employers will be unable to afford health insurance for their employees.

11. DON'T LIMIT ACCESS TO PICKUP TRUCKS. (Roll Call Vote 48). The pro-small business vote was to reject putting limits on access to pickup trucks through higher mileage regulations. Pickups are vital vehicles for many small businesses.

12. KEEP THE DEATH TAX IN THE GRAVE. (Roll Call Vote 151). The pro-small business vote was to make the repeal of the death tax permanent and not allow it to go automatically back into effect.

13. EXPAND U.S. MARKETS ABROAD. (Roll Call Vote 207). The pro-small business vote was to grant President Bush Trade Promotion Authority, which gives the President greater power to negotiate trade agreements and open foreign markets to U.S. products. 96% of exporters are small businesses.

14. OVERTURN CLINTON REGULATIONS. (Roll Call Vote 15). The pro-small business vote was to overturn a set of sweeping "ergonomics" regulations snuck in during the last days of the Clinton administration. These regulations would have cost American businesses \$129 billion to implement, resulting in lost jobs.

15. DON'T BRING BACK THE DEATH TAX. (Roll Call Vote 149). The pro-small business vote was to reject a proposal to permanently leave the death tax in effect after 2009.
